DOMAINS OF EXCELLENCY – STRONG AND ORIGINAL POINTS OF RESEARCH

1. Theoretical morphology

1.1. Specialization on compounding: one of the few morphologists in the world to have a similar specialization.

Proofs:

- (a) Two books on compounding, one written in Greek and the other in English (see publications).
- (b) Many articles on compounding (see publications), mostly on Greek, but also on the comparison of Greek compounds with those of other languages (e.g., among others, German, Romance and Turkish, see articles no 1,4 and 7 in the list of 15 publications, section *Peer-review articles in international journals*).
- (c) Ph.Ds on Greek compounding and on the comparison of Greek with other languages, for instance, with English, German, Turkish and Ukrainian.
- (d) Chapters in international handbooks dealing with compounding, one on Greek compounding (2009, *The Oxford Handbook of Compounding*, Oxford University Press) and another on Coordinative compounds which will appear in *The Encyclopedia of Research in Linguistics*, Oxford University Press.
- (e) Involvement in inter-scientific collaborations with respect to compounding:
 1. collaboration with the Canadian-based Mental Lexicon research team and other psycholinguists for the psycholinguistic treatment of compounds, which has led to the production of a number of articles (see articles no 10 and 31 in section *Peer-review articles in international journals* and article no 42 in the section *peer-review conference proceedings*).
 2. collaboration with computer scientists for the computational treatment of compounds (see article no 19 in section *Peer-review articles in international journals*, article no 10 in section *Peer review thematic volumes*, article no 23 in section *Peer review conference proceedings*).
- (f) Development of an electronic data base on dialectal compounds which counts about 12.000 entries, theoretically analyzed as for constituency, headedness, idiosyncratic properties. After completion, the data base will be stored at the *Laboratory of Modern Greek Dialects*.

Major contribution:

- (a) A. Ralli has provided a meticulous description, a thorough analysis and the diachronic development of compounding in her native tongue (Greek).
- (b) On international grounds, she is the only one to point out that the process of compounding cannot be universally treated as either morphological or syntactic but cuts across two grammatical domains, morphology and syntax, depending on the language, and that there

may be languages which have both types of compounding (see article no 7 in the list of 15 publications, section *Peer-review articles in international journals*).

1.2. (a) Beside the publication of a considerable number of articles on the other processes, that is, on derivation and inflection, she has written the only existing text book on *Theoretical Morphology* which is taught in Greek Universities (see list of 15 publications).

(b) She has founded the bi-annual international conference *Mediterranean Morphology Meeting* (MMM), together with Professor Geert Booij (Leiden University) and Professor Sergio Scalise (Università degli Studi di Bologna).

(c) In 2009, she founded, and since then directs, the bi-annual journal *Patras Working Papers in Linguistics* (<http://pwpl.lis.upatras.gr>).

Major contribution: Since the early 90's, Prof. Ralli's research in theoretical morphology as well as her teaching and other activities have triggered interest in morphology and led to the introduction of courses on Morphology in most Greek universities, where her work *Morphology* (Athens: Patakis, 2005) is used as the main text book.

2. Morphology and dialectal variation.

2.1 Angela Ralli was one of the first morphologists to perceive that the study of dialects offers new challenges to morphology, since dialects form an important source of morphological phenomena which are often hidden when research is limited to the standard form of languages. Moreover, she has recognized that dialectal morphology can be profitable for typology and historical morphology, because the study of dialects may elucidate possible language structures and language change. Prof. Ralli's publications on dialectal morphology open new directions to research, shedding light on several theoretical issues, such as the notions of headedness (see, for instance, article no 22 in section *Peer-review articles in international journals* and articles no 21 and 28 in section *Peer-review articles in collective volumes*), allomorphy (see article no 15 in *Peer-review articles in collective volumes*), affixoids (see article no 29 in section *Peer-review articles in international journals* and article no 24 in section *Peer-review articles in collective volumes*), the relation of compounding and derivation (see article 18 in section *Peer-review articles in international journals* and articles no 19 and 24 in section *Peer-review articles in collective volumes*), paradigmatic levelling (see article no 15 in section *Peer-review articles in international journals*).

2.2 Within the purpose of promoting dialectal research, Angela Ralli:

(a) has published a dictionary of the Asia Minor dialectal varieties of Kydonies and Moschonisia and the dialect of Eastern Lesbos;

(b) has founded the *Laboratory of Modern Greek Dialects* (<http://lmgd.philology.upatras.gr>) at the Department of Philology of the University of Patras in 2000, the first, and till now the only one, in a Greek University (<http://lmgd.philology.upatras.gr>), where there are about 400 hours of dialectal narratives, collected through field work and a specialized library with rare books and documents of dialectal interest;

(c) has conducted research expeditions within the purpose of documenting, and thus preserving, the following dialectal varieties on the way to extinction: 1. Greek in the Salento area (South Italy): 45 hours of oral narratives. 2. Aivaliot (Asia Minor): 55 hours of oral narratives. 3. Cunda Cretan (West Turkey): 12 hours. 4. Pontic (Black Sea area): 25 hours, 5. Cappadocian (Misti variety): 25 hours. 6. Lesbian (Aegean island of Lesbos): 30 hours. These oral corpora are stored in an electronic data base at the *Laboratory of Modern Greek Dialects* of the University of Patras.

(d) In 2000, she founded the bi-annual International Conference of *Modern Greek Dialects*

and *Linguistic Theory* (MGDLT), together with Professor Brian Joseph (Ohio State University) and Professor Mark Janse (Ghent University);

(e) has undertaken international projects on dialectal research;

(f) has encouraged dialect speaking people to provide descriptions of their dialect (see the books *The dialect of Cythera* by G. Katsouda (Athens: Association of Cytherian Studies 2016), and *The dialect of Ithaca* by D. Simiris (Patras: Laboratory of Modern Greek Dialects 2017);

(g) has edited a book on the *Morphology of Asia Minor Dialects* (to appear in Brill);

(h) has published and commented unedited dialectal works (e.g. the books by L. Strani (*Stou ambelione tsi fourkades* (2014) and *With the second moon of August* (2017), both written in the dialect of the island of Zante), published books (no 5 of books/monographs), edited books (see no 10 and 11 in the section of *edited volumes*) and wrote papers of theoretical interest (see no 21, 22, 25, 29, 30, 32, 33, 38,40 in the section of *peer-review papers in international journals*, no 15, 21, 24-28, 32, 33, 36 in *peer-review papers in collective volumes*, and no 22, 31, 32, 37, 39, 40, 44, 45, 47 in *peer-review conference proceedings*);

(i) has collaborated with computer scientists for the computational treatment of dialectal data (see article no 34, section *Peer review thematic volumes*, and articles no 48-50 in section *Peer review conference proceedings*);

(j) has conceived and directed the development of an electronic data base of dialectal compounds which counts about 12.000 entries, theoretically analyzed as for constituency, headedness, idiosyncratic properties. After completion, the data base will be stored at the *Laboratory of Modern Greek Dialects*.

Major contribution: Angela Ralli has contributed to the scientific study of the morphology of Modern Greek dialects, which, since the 19th century, was limited to either purely descriptive studies or ‘amateur’ works. Beside the theoretical linguistic value of her work, her research and other activities have contributed to the revival of interest in the field of dialectal variation, and to the preservation of Greek linguistic heritage.

3. Language contact

Recently, Angela Ralli has been actively involved in the study of how several languages of different families and typologies have affected Greek in various periods of its long history. She has particularly focused on:

(a) the Asia Minor varieties of Cappadocian, Pontic and Aivaliot, but also on Lesbian and Cretan, which have been influenced by the agglutinative Turkish;

(b) Italiot (Greek of South Italy) and Heptanesian (dialect of the Ionian islands) which have been under a Romance influence.

To this purpose, she:

(a) has undertaken several important research projects on language contact (see section of research projects);

(b) has written numerous articles on several morphological issues regarding the integration of loans, both nominal and verbal (see articles of all sections since 2012);

(c) has edited one collective volume (*Contact Morphology of Modern Greek Dialects*, Cambridge Scholars Publishing 2016);

(d) has written the chapter on the relation of Greek and Romance to appear in the *Oxford*

Encyclopedia of Romance Languages (ed. by Michele Loporcaro et al.);

(e) has undertaken, and since January 2017 scientifically co-directs (with Assoc. Prof. Tassos Anastassiadis, McGill), a huge research project involving four universities, three from Canada (McGill, York and SFU) and one from Greece (University of Patras) on the history and language of first-generation Greek immigrants in Canada.
